

Vine House - Last Weekend of Every Month


On the last weekend of each month we have the use of Vine House.

This gem in Mahurangi Harbour is a 2 km paddle from Sullivans Bay, which is the ARC park at the end of the Mahurangi West Road, first on the right past Puhoi.

The house sleeps 10 and has all creature comforts. Bring sleeping bag, pillow case and food. A shared meal and nibbles is the norm for Saturday night, so bring your goodies.

Lagoon Bay is very tidal, so bringing a kayak trolley is a good idea. The range of paddling is endless, eg Waiwera, Warkworth, Kawau Island, Motuora Island – your choice. Or just rest and read and enjoy this tranquil and special place. We recommend you take a carry bag to get all your gear up the track to the house. Secure parking is at Sullivans Bay. Leave a note on your dashboard reading "Vine House Volunteer" when you park in front of the ranger's house.

KASK Forum, Anakiwa

This year Su and I ticked this one on our calendar, booked and paid for it, then took off in our newly-acquired motor home for the South Island.

Neither of us had been back to explore the mainland at leisure since the unforgettable trip in the Auckland Canoe Club bus at Christmas 1967! Therefore we left Auckland at the end of February, giving us plenty of time to re-discover the South Island before eventually meeting up with over one hundred other sea kayakers at the Outward Bound School in Anakiwa. Amongst them were several familiar faces from Auckland and the Auckland Canoe Club.

The forum catered for all levels of sea kayakers emphasising on-water activities. Volunteer instructors from all over New Zealand and Australia passed on their skills and knowledge. Practising paddle strokes, rolls, towing and rescues was done just off the jetty in waist-deep water.

Fortunately we had great sunny days, but air and water temperatures were a bit chilly. The practical sessions were complemented with lectures about cooking, electronic gadgets, favourite paddling destinations, improve your photos, paddling with kids, and more.

Su and I both struggled to put together a timetable with our favourite subjects. Unfortunately we missed out on some interesting topics. Besides several trip reports from New Zealand and overseas with great

videos, the highlights were presentations from Paul Hayward and Natasha Romoff about "Alaska without Cruise Ship", and Max and Melanie Grant's "South Island Circumnavigation".

The Alaska trip was done from Auckland with a Feathercraft folding kayak in their luggage. Father and daughter Grant successfully paddled around the South Island in several "bites" in what was not planned to become a complete circumnavigation.

"Five Favourite NZ Destinations" and "Solo Coastal Paddling" by Colin Quilter were riveting contributions. We felt like packing up our gear and following Colin in his paddling strokes.

The forum closed with an overnight paddle to Mistletoe Bay in the Queen Charlotte Sounds. The rain and strong winds held off until the tents were up just before dark. Everybody then congregated in a shelter the size of a large Skyline garage, cooking dinner and socialising.

Participating in the KASK Forum left us with a sense of great pride and satisfaction. The wide range and standard of the topics and workshops run by qualified and enthusiastic kayakers enriched everybody.

President's Report

Dear All,

At last I can report that we have a signed agreement of the lease of our premises at The Landing. This is a lease in conjunction with Ian Ferguson and gives us secure tenure of our space. The lease is for 5-year term with a right of renewal but the initial contract is for 6 months when the terms are to be reviewed. I will explain the details at the AGM.

As part of that agreement, the toilets in the building have been made operational by Council and we have an agreement with Ian Ferguson to help maintain them. In return our rent has significantly reduced. Throughout this protracted negotiation we have had the valued support and assistance of our Club Member Rick Norris, a partner in Jackson Russell lawyers.

I was invited by the Chairperson of the Local Community Board to give a presentation on the future of The Landing as the Community Board is now responsible for future leases on The Landing.

I presented last week and received a positive response. Also raised by the Committee was the future of the Queens Wharf Shed as a possible Multi-User Building.

Lastly as I raised last month, the Club has been donated a large prominent stand at the Hutchwilco Boat Show and the Committee decided to present the "History of Kayaking". I want to take this opportunity to thank those involved in organising this display – headed by Trevor Arthur and Jim Mason, supported by many others.
